## CELEBRATING OUR COMMUNITY OUTREACH

### SEPTEMBER MEETING WILL FEATURE THE G.E.N.I.U.S. GIRLS

The September regular branch meeting will feature, as part of our highlighting our community outreach projects, a presentation by the G.E.N.I.U.S. girls (**G**irls **E**xploring **N**ew **I**deas **U**sing **S**cience) who won the state robotic competition and competed in the national robotics competition in St. Louis, Missouri in April.

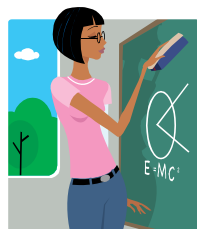
The girls will show a video with the background of their team and do a 5-minute project presentation, which includes a demonstration of the prototype backup system they built on a manual wheelchair. After demoing the prototype, they will show a video of how they implemented their project by installing cameras on the electric wheelchairs of two children and will do a brief demo of their robot.

We look forward to meeting these girls that we helped to sponsor and to congratulate them on their achievements.

We will also highlight the girls from Sedalia Park Elementary that we sent to the 5<sup>th</sup> grade science field trip at Rock Eagle 4-H Center and will have a report from the NCCWSSL student we supported.

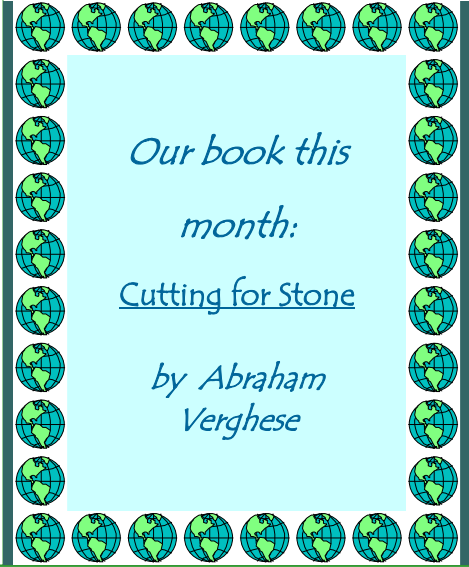

## CONVENTION NOTES

One of the most interesting events at the National AAUW Convention in Washington, D. C. this summer, was our lobbying of Congress. The eight Georgia delegates (four of whom were from the Cobb Branch!) headed for the capitol along with many of the other 800 delegates to the convention (the "Big Teal Machine") to lobby for three main issues. We met with the staff persons at Saxby Chambliss's and Johnny Isaacson's office – then went off to our congressperson's offices. This article will report on the first of the issues we lobbied for. Later issues will address the other two items.

Members lobbied Congress to oppose any cuts to **Social Security**. Sunday, August 14, marked the 76th anniversary of Social Security. When it began in 1935, Social Security paid retirement benefits only to workers, not their spouses or children. Social Security has evolved to become one of the most successful anti-poverty programs in our nation's history. It's a national commitment to care for one another across generations. It is particularly important for women's economic security, since more than half of older women would fall into poverty without Social Security benefits.

Yet Social Security faces challenges. The renewed focus on America's deficit has prompted many politicians to pledge to "reform" Social Security, which they (incorrectly) blame for the deficit. Other proposals would raise the retirement age, cut benefit levels, or privatize Social Security accounts. Social Security did not cause the federal deficit — in fact, the program is "off budget" — and should not be blamed for it or weakened to address America's financial problems. In poll after

poll, Americans across the political and age spectrum have affirmed that they would rather pay more in taxes than see Social Security benefits cut.

AAUW believes that it is vital to women's economic security to provide for the long-term solvency of Social Security and to maintain its current guaranteed benefits and strongly opposes attempts to cut Social Security.

You can do that too by visiting AAUW's Two-Minute Activist and telling Congress that you oppose cutting a critical program relied upon by millions of Americans.

### AAUW's Research Reports

Many of us know about the research reports funded and published by AAUW. AAUW has been at the forefront of research on issues of women and education for decades and has published reports on topics including girls in science, sex discrimination in academia, women and online learning, sexual harassment in schools, the impact of Title IX, Latinas in schools, and single-sex education among others. (Reports may be [downloaded from the web](#) and are also available at [ShopAAUW](#).)

AAUW's trailblazing **1885** research report, *Health Statistics of Women College Graduates* helped to debunk the idea that if women went to college, it would adversely affect their ability to have children, as silly as that seems today.

Our 2010 report *Why So Few? Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics* (STEM). sparked important dialogue at the United Nations, in the federal government, and in the media. Astronaut and pioneer Sally Ride even referenced the report on NPR.

Reports such as these are one of the important things that our membership helps support. The quality of the research is impeccable, and these reports influence the way women and girls are treated. Be proud of what you are helping to support by your being a part of this great organization.
