

## ROVING GOURMET

Directions to The Magnolia Thomas Restaurant in Woodstock

- Take I-75 North
- Merge onto I-575 N/GA-5 N via EXIT 268 toward Canton for 5.7 miles
- Take the Towne Lake Pkwy exit, EXIT 8, toward Woodstock for .3 mile
- Keep right to take the ramp toward Woodstock for .3 mile
- Turn slight right onto Towne Lake Parkway for .6 mile
- Towne Lake Pky becomes Arnold Mill Road for .2 mile
- **108 ARNOLD MILL RD is on the right.**  
 (If you reach Bentley Parkway, you've gone a little too far)

### OR

- From I-75 take the Canton Road exit and continue on Canton Road, which becomes Canton Highway . Go approximately 9 miles
- Turn right onto Towne Lake Parkway, which becomes Arnold Mill Road for 0.2 miles - **108 ARNOLD MILL RD is on the right.**
