

Our 51st annual BOOKFAIR is Sept. 26- Oct. 3, 2010 at Perimeter Mall. As you know, bookfair is our fundraiser. This is where we get the money for scholarships, as well as all the projects (such as STEM, our NCCWSL student, and Science Camp scholarships at Sedalia Park Elementary,) that we support throughout the year. Our Cobb share of the profits is directly proportional to the number of hours our Cobb members work, both in the bookroom and at Bookfair. Please, say "yes" when our indefatigable Peg Montgomery calls you to volunteer.

When you say yes, you will receive an e-mail from Barbara Buchanan (of Atlanta branch) about a week before Bookfair, laying out guidelines, such as "leave your purse in your trunk," where to sign in when you arrive, etc. We have had no reports of security problems at Perimeter Mall, but if you are at all apprehensive about returning to your auto at the end of your shift, one of us will happy to serve as an escort.

We always try to honor volunteer requests for work assignments. Do let us know not only when you want to work, but what

you want to do. Since I am the Banking Chair, I promise to supply adequate training if you are a cashier, and I will make sure you get adequate potty breaks, as well as lunch or dinner breaks if you are working more than one shift.

One of the advantages of Bookfair is that those of us who aren't working in the bookroom all year get a chance to work alongside our Atlanta Branch and North Fulton Branch sisters, and it is always a pleasure to see everyone again. You'll be glad you said "yes" to Peg.

We will do that for those four meetings listed in the directory, but the Sept. 14 and Dec. 14th receptions are separate, and each member attendee pays individually for those. Any questions? Our board, meeting at the Bookroom on August 21, approved our program ideas.

Lastly, our special thanks go out to Karen Peters and Debbie Karvey once again, for all the time they spend throughout the year getting ready for bookfair. Also to Carol Stephens, Marie Shockley, and Gene & Shirley Mills for emptying the bookbin here in Cobb. Together, we all boost Cobb's hours, as well as further the work of AAUW.
