




Kennesaw State AAUW Branch!

The dream of having a student branch of AAUW at Kennesaw State University is finally a reality! Most organizations are lucky to have one faculty advisor, but the new KSU AAUW has four! Dr. Meg Murray from Computer Science, Dr. Angela Blaver from Educational Leadership, Dr. Amy Buddie from Gender & Women's Studies, and Cobb Branch member Barbara Hammond from the Music Dept. have led the way through the process. The four faculty members approached several enthusiastic students who are known leaders and "go -getters." Students Cara Sperry, Meghan Hollister, Lily Wilkerson, and Katherine Acuff met with faculty members as a team to discuss the possibilities. In April, the group drew up a Constitution and By Laws, and obtained the signatures of 15 students who would be interested in These documents were submitted for review on April 14. joining. Megan Hollister made a presentation on April 21 before SABAC (Student Government), asking for Registered Student Organization status. She had Meg Murray and Barbara Hammond in the cheering section. The proposal was accepted and the group now has permission to begin meetings and activities in the Fall. The next step along the way was to obtain the AAUW "connection." Dr. Meg Murray sent a letter to President Papp asking for permission for institutional status and university funding of the \$325 needed to accomplish this final goal. Dr. Papp agreed---so the KSU AAUW branch will be a reality! The Cobb Chapter has been waiting patiently for several years for this wonderful collaboration to happen! Many thanks for the encouragement and advice given by Carol Stephens, Debbie Karvey and Shirley Mills. Whoo Hoo!

We have had a busy month! In addition to our regular activities, like Roving Gourmet and Book Groups, our AAUW Cobb branch hosted the AAUW Georgia State Convention April 16-17, with some assistance from our local sister branches, Atlanta and North Fulton. The state convention was held in Kennesaw, in order to coordinate it with the Phenomenal Woman Conference at Kennesaw State University on April 16. Several of our local members also attended the Phenomenal Woman event.

At the Friday night banquet, we had 34 people. We held it at the Mansour Center, as we wanted folks around the state to experience our new meeting facilities. The Mansour Center did a good job on the dinner, and our Cobb branch took that opportunity to share the highlights of our activities this past year. The speaker for Friday night was Audrey L. Salgado, who is in place to assist branches in ordering our activities. (Atlanta branch is planning to use Ms. Salgado's services in June, and Cobb plans to piggyback on that meeting. On Saturday, April 17, at the Wingate by Wyndham off Barrett Parkway, we had 41 people in attendance.
