Commissioner Cupid is a community advocate and public servant representing Cobb County residents as a Commissioner of District 4. Her goals of supporting fair, effective government and helping communities and businesses thrive are sought through her overall mission of putting people first. Commissioner Cupid's service in Cobb began with volunteering in her homeowner's association and evolved into service with the Austell Community Taskforce where she formed a partnership of service organizations in the Six Flags area.

Commissioner Cupid has been willing to make tough decisions to keep people informed, engaged, and ultimately pleased with the level of service they receive through the county. Commissioner Cupid recognizes that the needs of the District are great, but the spirit and potential of the District are greater.

Commissioner Cupid is a certified mediator and has previously worked across various fields as a manufacturing engineer and supervisor, state policy analyst, assistant project manager in affordable housing, and an executive assistant in the nonprofit sector.
