From Marie Shockley our Public Policy officer:

I participated in a conference call on Wednesday, September 16 at 7:30 pm with State Policy Analyst Kate Neilson, and Political Manager Amy Bulker, who addressed new state level data that is to be sent to the states on the 17th. Ms. Neilson stated that she has been with AAUW for approximately six months, and is developing data to update the national wage gap numbers, including state by state initiatives and analysis. While there has been a small increase, it is not enough. New data gives more information on pay gap, equal pay laws, more information of state laws, and employer relationships. Both are excited about the information and what they propose that branches do with this information. Rates of pay were included, levels of pay, rate and national origin issues and all of this is state specific. We were encouraged to share the following links with membership. Ms. Bulker spoke of resources for legislative and media outreach, including sample letters and/iop ed pieces. A discussion was also held in reference to measuring the political potential and use of social media, as well as new laws.

Both stated that they would be available if needed.
