

WOMAN OF THE YEAR

We are delighted to celebrate **Nancy Walther** as our Woman of the Year. Nancy is the Superintendent of the Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park in Marietta. One of very few women to head a national park, Nancy began her career with the National Park Service in 1992 as a living history interpretive ranger at the Chesapeake & Ohio Canal National Historical Park. After her first season there, she was promoted to supervisor of the interpretive program in the lower district of the park, which receives one million visitors per year. In 1996, after the park was devastated by two major floods, Walther became the park's volunteer coordinator. In two years she coordinated more than 390 projects and engaged 7,600 volunteers who gave more than 30,000 hours to assist with the rebuilding of the park. Her position grew to include partnership work with local businesses, non-profit organizations, and other private entities.

In 2002, Walther moved to Atlanta and became the chief of resource education at Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area, where she managed the park's education, interpretation, and fee programs. Under her leadership, Chattahoochee's fee program grossed \$730,000 in FY 2011. She took over her new post in early November 2012.

She holds a bachelor's degree in parks, recreation, and leisure studies from George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia. She is a native of Northern Virginia and currently lives in Marietta with her husband, Dan, and her 16-year old step-daughter, Jessica. She spends her personal time canoeing, biking, hiking, and gardening.

The State Convention was Inspiring

The Georgia AAUW 2013 State Convention at the Country Inn & Suites in Marietta was a collaborative coming together for guests and members that was a great success.

Following an awards banquet on Friday night, April 26th, which recognized the successes and philanthropy of Georgia branches, there was a showing of the documentary film, *The Invisible War*. This film examines a military framework that enables abuse and ignores victims. Several profound personal stories of abuse are unfortunately played out within a hierarchy more concerned with protecting its image than pursuing justice. The documentary is a very powerful indictment of the need for the passage of the STOP Act.

On Saturday, one of our special guests, Patricia Ho, AAUW Vice President, spoke to AAUW's future by embracing positive opportunities for change and by extending mission priorities across multiple communities and platforms. Patricia Ho is a highly qualified and experienced candidate running for the office of AAUW President. We will look to support her at our national convention in New Orleans, June 9th – June 13th.

It was our honor to host Jessica Hinves, an LAF Plaintiff and amazingly brave young woman featured in the film, *The Invisible War*. LAF (AAUW's Legal Advocacy Fund) supports women's cases of gender discrimination and sexual abuse. To hear her story, to understand her struggles and to appreciate her commitment to passage of the STOP Act is truly admirable. We loved getting to know her, and will be there to support her and support the STOP Act.

During the Georgia AAUW business meeting, two key issues were presented and voted on by the delegates present. State dues are now \$10 annually, effective immediately. Georgia AAUW will move to one member, one vote for all attendees at state meetings.

If you have not already made arrangements, please consider attending national convention in New Orleans, June 9th – June 13th. It is an energizing time and all attendees return with renewed focus and stories to share.
