It is hoped that we will also be able to continue with a summer program through Girls Inc for those who attended the fall Forum. Bea Piddock has generated Interview Questions for us. Please conduct interviews with family members, neighbors, friends, and co-workers over the next 6 weeks to 1) find out what makes an organization attractive to women to join and 2) use this as a tool to spread the word about AAUW to try to bring in new members, especially women in the 35-55 age range. We would like to collate the results of your efforts in May to help the new Exec. Bd. better plan for the coming years. If everyone contacts only 2 people, we will have reached out to over 80 women!!

Sedalia Park financial efforts were very successful! We were able to send 4 fifth grade girls to Jekyll Island to science camp! We have received a T shirt and 4 thank you notes along with the girls pictures. If someone who has a digital camera could bring it to the State Convention, we could take some pictures to use on our website as well as to send out to local papers. I will bring everything to the next meeting in May!

Our State Convention is soon upon us! You have all been invaluable in your support and ideas! Nancy and Pam have done a great job in gathering items for our goodie bags! All seems to be progressing well with everything and we are expecting close to 40 attendees!
