Dr. Amy Stevens, Advocate GA Military Women

Our most recent branch meeting on February 10th, at Sterling Estates found dynamic advocates addressing us about Female Military Veterans transitioning to civilian life. This informational program was presented by one of our members, Dr. Amy Stevens, a Navy Veteran and an advocate who provides counseling and consulting services as well as a Facebook outreach for GA

Military Women. Also addressing the members was Kim Scofi, with Battle Buddy of United Military Care.org. It certainly was an eyeopening look into the challenges of women serving in the military, especially as they transition back to civilian life. Some of the stories relayed spoke to homelessness, PTSD and mental challenges adjusting to civilian life, as well as the very personal story of a Cobb County resident, Kisha Holmes, who killed herself and her children recently. It was a wakeup call that rang across the local and national news recently. At this time, Amy and Kim's organizations are looking for individuals to step up and help out in even the smallest way – donating time, donating household goods, donating funds ... anything and everything to support those who have served and/or continue to serve us.



Legislative Events:

In principle and in practice AAUW values and seeks a diverse membership. AAUW Atlanta Branch Legislative Issues Meeting: Ansley Golf Club on February 7th.

Guest speakers addressing key issues of AAUW policy concern in Georgia were Taifa Butler of the GBPI, Charmaine Davis of 9to5 and Dalia Racine, DeKalb County CSEC Attorney.

Taifa Butler put some real nuts and bolts together to help those in attendance appreciate the monetary impact and influences in policy decisions related to the state budget. GBPI advocates for a strong work force to be the base for business opportunities in Georgia. Instead of promising budget compromising tax cuts to bring business to Georgia, the focus should be on developing and providing a strong work force.

Charmaine Davis reported on the progress for the Family Care Act bill (HB 92) to successfully get to the floor of the house for a vote. There are some hoped for updates that will boost the potential for the FCA bill sponsored by Tommy Benton of Jefferson to be approved during this legislative session.

Dalia Racine provided eye-opening statistics and stories to highlight the work that needs to be done to aid children commercially sexually exploited children and to combat a multi-billion dollar industry that poses unique threats to children in our community as well as the legal / court systems working to protect and defend our communities and our at-risk children.

Cobb Branch attendees were Marie Shockley, Cobb AAUW Public Policy Chair and Debbie Karvey, Georgia AAUW Public Policy Chair.

Lobby Day Events:

Following the legislative issues briefing, Georgia, Cobb and Atlanta AAUW Public Policy participated in a very rewarding lobby day. On February 12th at the Freight Depot, over 500 supporters gathered with Street Grace, Georgia Cares, Wellspring Living and Youth Spark to campaign for passage of Senator Rene Unterman's bill to protect at-risk children forced into sex trafficking, to provide safe harbor after being rescued and harsher penalties for perpetrators and purchasers involved in child sex trafficking. In attendance were Diana Witt and Betty Slater of the Atlanta Branch and Debbie Karvey, Cobb Branch.

On February 18th, AAUW participated in lobbying with the League of Women Voters to ask representatives to vote NO on HB194 which would negatively impact early voting ... "Hands Off Early Voting" lobby day participants worked the ropes at the capitol to talk with representatives.

AAUW members continues to collaborate with Georgia Job and Family Collaborative to promote passage of the Family Care Act ... and support is asked to contact Industry and Labor Committee Members to request favorable passage of the bill out of committee. Hearing is scheduled for March 4th in the Coverdell Legislative Office Building (CLOB.)
