BOOKFAIR UPDATES

Sharon Bevis-Hoover's message accurately sums up decisions made by the steering committee:

Based upon the continuing COVID pandemic, the Bookfair Steering Committee made the very difficult decision to cancel this fall's Bookfair. In addition, the Committee agreed that it is unlikely that we will have another Bookfair on the scale of our historical fairs based on increasing financial costs of holding the event and on the substantial demands that the event puts on our volunteers.

In addition, our lease on the warehouse where we store our tables, bookshelves, etc. is up at the end of August, and we do not have the option to extend that date. The Committee was not yet ready to give up the properties, but it was also hesitant to enter into a new, costly lease for storage. As a result, we will be moving most of the properties into the Bookroom for now.

Given those two decisions, we moved most of the books that were already packed to Thriftbooks, where we will make some money for them over the coming months.

Many of you have already been brainstorming on smaller, shorter, and/or more cost effective events for next year and beyond. Suggestions have included participating in the Jewish book festival; having a presence at the Decatur Book Festival; selling vintage children's books at an art festival; selling children's books at back to school events for teachers or parents, or at home schooler events. As a result, we did hold back some books that would fit those suggestions.

<u>Please let the Steering Committee know of any other ideas that you have.</u> The Steering Committee will be meeting again on August 19.

We will continue listing books for sale online, and participating in events held by the Georgia Antiquarian Booksellers Association.

<u>For now, please continue to sort, price, and box books as before.</u> We will be adjusting where we stack the categories in the coming week.
